The experience at the Museum was a bit overwhelming for many of us. The reality of the audio and visual reenactments of the Vietnam conflict was unnerving. The Vietnam Wall lists the names of the casualties of war. We identified a classmate who was our class' first casualty as well as other graduates of CPHS. As we continued the tour, the veterans in our class were reminded of their military journey as they shared their respective experiences. So many lives were lost during the Vietnam conflict. 

the ultimate sacrifice of all of those who lost their lives to protect this country and thankful for all who returned home. Our first day together ended with a long return drive to Quincy.

The feeling of nostalgia was heightened as we arrived on campus. As we entered the cafeteria, classmates remembered where they sat, who sat with them and recalled their favorite meals. Lunch period was also a time to socialize. One of the most exciting and memorable occasions occurred when we toured our beloved Carter-Parramore High School (CPHS). As we walked toward the building, you could imagine the sounds of the yellow school buses arriving and departing the school around the circle, the chatter among the students as they hurried to their respective homerooms and their teachers standing outside the door awaiting their arrivals.

We entered the building, and you could immediately feel the presence of our teachers and hear the echoes of their voices. Especially, the unmistakably voice of the greatest high school principal of all times, Mr. Verdell D. Hamilton. When Mr. Hamilton spoke, you listened. He genuinely cared about his student body. Amazingly, my classmates remembered the location of their homerooms and the classrooms of all our teachers.
